

OCCUPANCY AND USE RESTRICTION

ARAPAHO & ROOSEVELT NATIONAL FORESTS
PAWNEE NATIONAL GRASSLAND

Hewlett Fire Closure of Trails, Trailheads and Area

Pursuant to Title 16, United States Code § 551, 36 Code of Federal Regulations § 261.50(a & b), the following act is prohibited within the Canyon Lakes Ranger District of the Roosevelt National Forest at: the Greyrock and Hewlett Gulch Trailheads (T8N, R70W, section 6; T8N, R71W, sections 1 & 2; T9N, R71W, sections 25, 26, 35 & 36); their associated trails, the Greyrock Trail, the Greyrock Meadows Trail and the Hewlett Gulch Trail (the "Restricted Trailhead and Trails") and the area surrounding the Trails (the "Restricted Area"). The Restricted Trailheads, Trails and Area are depicted on the attached map, hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A. The purpose of this Order is to protect life due to hazards from the Hewlett Fire.

PROHIBITED ACT:

1. Going into or being upon the Restricted Trailheads and Trails. 36 CFR § 261.53(e).
2. Being on National Forest System lands in the Restricted Area. 36 CFR § 261.53(e).

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this ORDER:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission; and
2. Any Federal, State or local officer or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This Order shall remain in effect until rescinded or until midnight December 31, 2012 whichever event occurs first.
